Who we are: Shinganda Wildlife Wilderness (SWW), formerly known as Shinganda-Lumba Conservancy, was established as a wildlife restoration project in 2001, after receiving support from Chief Mushima. SWW is an unfenced, open-ecosystem conservancy, situated about 50km north-west of Kafue National Park and is a large tract of protected, intact wildlife habitat, linked to the national park via a functional conservation corridor, allowing the movement and survival of wide-ranging wildlife like African painted dogs, lions and elephants. SWW forms an integral part of the conservation area network in the Greater Kafue Ecosystem, providing holistic protection for a wide range of carnivores, herbivores and their habitat in the region.

What we do: SWW provides enhanced wildlife security in the NW sector of the Greater Kafue, through anti-poaching patrols, camera surveillance and monitoring, in collaboration with the Zambia Department of National Parks and Wildlife, Painted Dog Conservation Inc and the Zambia Carnivore Program. Our field staff are all Kaonde-speaking people, with their home villages situated within the Mushima Chiefdom.
